## VOWELS

## ABCDEFGHIJKLMNOPQRSTUVWXYZ

When sounding out vowels, your breath flows freely through the mouth.

There are 26 letters in the alphabet.
$\mathbf{5}$ of them are vowels: $\mathbf{A}, \mathbf{E}, \mathbf{I}, \mathbf{O}$, and $\mathbf{U}$.

The letter $\mathbf{Y}$ is sometimes considered a sixth vowel because it can sound like other vowels.

The rest of the letters in the alphabet are called consonants.

When a vowel sounds like its name, this is called a long sound. A vowel letter can also have short sounds. You will learn about long and short sounds in the next lessons.

## Long "e" Sound

## The long "e" sound can be spelled in many ways.

1) It can be represented by two vowel teams, "ee" and "ea"
2) The irregular vowel team "ie"
3) The open syllable "e" (Example: me)
4) $Y$ as the vowel at the end of a word (Example: bunny)

1.eeThe rule in a vowel team is that if two vowels go walking, the first one does the talking. When two e's are combined, it produces the long "e" sound. The sound sounds just like the letter "e." Example: beet
2. 2 When the vowels $e$ and $a$ are combined, it produces the long "e" sound. The sound sounds just like the letter "e." Example: seat
3.ie This does not follow the vowel team rule. It is irregular. Here, the second vowel does the talking. The combination of $i$ and e make a long " $e$ " sound. Example: field

4.ethe open syllable " $e$ " simply makes a long " $e$ " sound. Example: she "e" sound. Example: bunny, funny, baby.

## a $\mathbf{N O U N}$ is a person, place or thing.

For example, this is Amy.
She is a person. Amy is a noun.

Sri Lanka is a noun. It is a place.

## Singular and Plural

A singular noun names one person, place or thing.
Example A lizard crawls on top of the rock.
There is only one lizard in the sentence, so the word lizard is a singular noun. Also there is only one rock in the sentence, so the word rock is a singular noun too.

A plural noun names more than one person, place or thing.
Example Two rabbits ran through the trees.
There is more than one rabbit, so the word rabbits is a plural noun.
Also there is more than one tree, so the word trees is a plural noun too.

## Combining numbers and nouns

A plural noun names more than one person, place or thing.

When something is more than one, it can be two things, ten things, or one hundred things.
We learned that to make a noun plural, you have to add "s" or "es" to the end of the word.

If you want to specify HOW MANY items there are, then you simply have to write the number before the word. Then make the word plural (if there are more than one).
